Stabilization Services



Helping those in crisis

Chum's stabilization services include the drop-in center/shelter,

where anyone can stay; a separate family shelter for up to six families experiencing homelessness; an onsite medical clinic; and housing advocates who work with each client to connect with community resources.

Congregational Outreach, Advocacy, and Organizing



The backbone of our organization

The 44 member congregations that support Chum are the core of who

we are. Caring individuals reach out, advocate, and organize for justice for those who have no one else to stand up for them.

Street Outreach



Serving those who cannot or will not stay in shelter

Chum's Street

Outreach Staff work with people who are living on the street, in the woods, or in other places unfit for human habitation.

Chum's Street Outreach works with about 150-200 people a year. We help them meet their basic needs, stabilize their housing, and reduce their contact with the police. We advocate for and with them when they are involved with law enforcement, corrections, health care and other public systems.

Food Distribution Services



Making sure everyone in Duluth is fed

Chum has two emergency food shelf locations in Duluth, MN, as well as a delivery

service for those who cannot get to our locations. In 2021 we delivered more than 100,000 pounds of food to those in need.

Housing Services



Responding to the housing shortage in Duluth

We help families at the Steve O'Neil

Apartments break generational cycles of homelessness and provide support to prosper in life.

At the St. Francis Apartments, we provide a safe place for seniors to create a home and accomplish their goals.

What's Next?

This year we will begin to expand our current shelter facilities – extending our second floor and adding an additional floor to the building that currently houses our drop-center, emergency shelter, and the Chum offices. We are receiving \$2 million from the Federal government, which will get us close to halfway there. To complete the project, we are also asking our Minnesota state legislature to invest funds in northern Minnesota to decisively deal with the housing and homelessness crisis.



Chum is also leading **Stepping On Up, a five-year plan to address unsheltered and sheltered homelessness in Duluth.**

Stepping On Up will make a person's stay at the shelter what it should be – short, temporary, and non-reoccurring. Three phases include plans for transitional housing with support services, and permanently affordable housing units available for all.

Duluth's shortage of housing causes long-term and chronic homelessness. Waitlists stretch from months (in rare cases) to more than 2 years for subsidized housing.

We believe Duluth needs low-cost units that are private, dignified, small scale to encourage community, culturally specific, harm reduction-based, and providing services including basic life skills like cleaning and cooking.

Phase 1: Authorized Outdoor Living Zones with Street Outreach

- Provide for basic shelter from the elements through the summer and fall months
- Reduce harm caused by substance abuse
- Decrease violence and calls for emergency services

Phase 2: Shelter Next Response - Indoor Villages or Tiny Home Park

- Provide increased privacy and safety for residents
- A step up from Shelter. Create space for couples and other people who cannot or will not use traditional, congregate shelter.

Phase 3: Transforming Response: Towards Long term Housing

- Move people out of shelter and the streets into supportive housing that can either be permanent or a continued step up depending on the person's need
- Embed culturally specific programming and activities
- Opportunities for vocational development
- Build life skills.

Chum is leading in innovative ways to change the face of homelessness, food insecurity, and poverty in Duluth.
